PROPOSED TAX RATES NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE FOR WEBB COUNTY PROPERTY OWNERS

Webb County property owners can now review the proposed tax rates, and the impact they could have on their property tax bill online at webbproptaxes.org.

According to Webb County Appraisal District Chief Appraiser Martin Villarreal, “The Property Tax Portal will provide property owners with an overview of their individual taxes with respect to different taxing entities, and specific details as to how the tax rates impact the amount tax payers will pay”.

The website allows property owners to type in their addresses and review the proposed tax rates for all of the taxing entities that pertain to their property. The website also breaks down how much of their tax bill goes to each taxing entity, shows the impact of the proposed rates on an owner’s property tax bill, and most importantly, lists upcoming hearings that property owners can attend. Additionally, it also provides a convenient online option where taxpayers can send feedback to their local taxing entities.

On August 07, 2020, Webb County Appraisal District mailed postcards to property owners informing them about the aforementioned Truth in Taxation portal. It is the Webb County Appraisal District's hope that the information provided in the portal will help taxpayers gain a better understanding of the differences between the NO NEW REVENUE RATE, PROPOSED RATE, and ADOPTED TAX RATE.
